Dear Madeleine Parents,

Soon many Christians around the world will begin the most solemn of holy days—Holy Thursday evening, Good Friday, Holy Saturday, and of course, Easter Sunday. As we move toward these important religious days, we should renew our efforts to pray often and well. Thus, on Easter Sunday morning, when Jesus triumphs over sin and death, we can joyfully proclaim with hundreds of other Christians, “Alleluia, the Lord has risen!” Have a Blessed Easter and a peaceful school break!

IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS

All students **entering grade 7** are required to have a **Tdap booster immunization**. The proof of this booster **must be given to our school office** by **Wednesday, May 15**. This is a county health regulation (AB 354). No child may start school on the first day of school without the Tdap booster immunization records on file. Thank you for your cooperation!

EARLY MORNING DROP OFF

Please remember that the **campus is not open until 7:45 a.m. in the morning**. No child can be on campus before this time unless they are supervised by a teacher in their classroom or checked in to day care. **Free day care** does not start **until 7:45 a.m.** Students who are dropped off early will be charged a fee and requested to sign up for the YMCA day care program. Thank you for your cooperation.

NEW TEXT ALERT SYSTEM

Parents, please don't forget to sign up for our new **text alert system**. To do this, you must go to the **Madeleine website** and click on the red alert button on the **top left-hand side** and follow the prompts to add your cell phone number. This alert system will be used for emergency situations and special reminders.

2013-2014 SCHOOL YEAR TUITION PAYMENT SCHEDULE

School of the Madeleine has changed the tuition and student fees schedule for the 2013-2014 school year. All families will pay **student fees for next year** this **May (2013)** and will start the **first tuition payment in July (2013)**. This new tuition schedule will have the last tuition payment due each April. This will help the school to better know its enrollment numbers and accept new students faster. Many school families now do not inform the school that they are planning to leave until August or even September. Often this leaves the school with no available students on the waiting lists because potential families have enrolled in their second choice of schools. Both student fees and the first month tuition **will be non-refundable**.

ESTABLISHING SUPPORTING PARISHIONER RATE

To establish a **supporting parishioner** rate for future school years, you must use your **weekly collection envelopes**. If you pay monthly or bi-monthly, you must turn in an empty envelope to demonstrate your weekly attendance at Mass. Participation in parish life and activities is also encouraged. This must be done for **one year (July to June)** **prior** to establishing a supporting parishioner rate.

EASTER VACATION

Easter vacation begins on **Friday, March 29** and school resumes on **Monday, April 8**. **Holy Thursday, March 28 is a minimum day with dismissal at 12 Noon.**

GRANDPARENTS' DAY

Please remember that **Grandparents' Day** is on **Friday, April 19**. **Grandparents will come to the classrooms starting at 11:00 a.m.** Please, grandparents, do not come before this time so each classroom will have an opportunity to prepare for your arrival. Each class is organizing special activities that the children can share with their grandparents on this day. There will be refreshments outside the classroom and photo opportunities. We will have students at the gate of the main school to help grandparents get to their correct classrooms. There is a special lot for over-flow parking at the First Baptist Church at 4608 Gardena Street. There will be shuttle service available for grandparents who need to park in this area and for most areas on the street. Parents, please park on the side streets and leave the school and over-flow parking lot available for the grandparents. Please mark the date and have your child call or send a special invitation to their grandparents.

SAFETY ON ILLION STREET

Please remember that there are no U-turns allowed on Illion Street. **Pulling into a driveway and backing up is considered a U-turn and a driver can be ticketed for this. Thank you for your cooperation.**

When using the church parking lot, **do not use your cell phones**. **It creates a safety hazard! Dogs should be left in your car or at home!**

If the passenger zone is filled during morning drop off or afternoon pick-up, please drive up to the church parking lot. Many neighbors have complained to us that Madeleine parents are **blocking the flow of traffic on Illion Street** by waiting to get into the passenger zone in front of the school. When students are present, please use the crosswalk. This sets a good example!

In addition, please **do not** ask **your child to wait at the bottom of the hill** on the corner of Illion and Gardenia. This is an unsupervised area and students are **not SAFE!** Please have them wait at the crest of the hill near the teacher on duty until they see you.

REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ADVANCED MATH PROGRAM

We are very fortunate to be able to offer an advanced math program for our students in grades 5-8. This program is totally free to our families and enables our gifted math students to work beyond their current grade level. The requirements to enter this program are listed below. However, students who do not enter the program starting in fifth grade can test into the advanced math program in later grades.

To enter program:

1. The student's math grades must be mostly "A's" (90%-100%). No math grade can be below a "B" (83%).
2. Iowa Assessments (*IA*) – The student must have National Stanines of 8's or 9's on the math section of the most recent *IA* tests.
3. The student must have an average of "Very Good" (VG) in Responsible Behavior grade on the present report card.
4. Student must complete and master the 5th grade concepts during the summer.
5. The student must pass the 5th grade mastery math test with an 85% or higher given at the beginning of the next school year.
6. Student must maintain academic success in all subjects.

To continue in program:

1. Maintain an 83% grade on course work.
2. 100% completion of all assignments given.
3. Maintain a VG or better behavior grade.
4. Be aware that homework is given on weekends to maintain needed pace of material.
5. Student will be placed on academic probation when grade falls below 83%.
6. Student will have one quarter (report card to report card) to bring up deficiencies.

Opting out of program:

1. If a student opts out of the program, they will not be allowed to enter at a later date.

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April Gospels and Questions for home reflection:

Gospel March 31, 2013

John 20:1-9 – Easter Sunday

On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them, "They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him." So Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb. They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first; he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in. When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place. Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed. For they did not yet understand the scripture that he had to rise from the dead.

Questions for Adults:

In the weeks ahead, we will hear how the first disciples moved from confusion, doubt, and skepticism to faith. How can their experience teach us how we too might receive this gift of faith from God? How has the understanding of Jesus' Resurrection unfolded for you throughout your life?

Questions for Children:

How do you think the disciples felt on the day of Jesus' death and during the days that followed? What do you think they were doing on these days? What would be your first thought had you found Jesus' tomb empty?

Gospel April 7, 2013

John 20:19-31 – 2nd Sunday of Easter

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins

you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." Thomas, called Didymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples said to him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nailmarks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe." Now a week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them. Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name.

Questions for Adults:

What gifts did Jesus give the disciples that you too have received in your baptism? How have you used those gifts to bear witness to Christ?

Questions for Children:

Think of a time when you did something wrong. You said "I'm sorry" and you were forgiven. How did it make you feel? How can you share Christ's peace with others?

Gospel April 14, 2013

John 21:1-19 – 3rd Sunday of Easter

After this, Jesus revealed himself again to his disciples at the Sea of Tiberias. He revealed himself in this way. Together were Simon Peter, Thomas called Didymus, Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, Zebedee's sons, and two others of his disciples. Simon Peter said to them, "I am going fishing." They said to him, "We also will come with you." So they went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing. When it was already dawn, Jesus was standing on the shore; but the disciples did not realize that it was Jesus. Jesus said to them, "Children, have you caught anything to eat?" They answered him, "No." So he said to them, "Cast the net over the right side of the boat and you will find something." So they cast it, and were not able to pull it in because of the number of fish. So the disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "It is the Lord." When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he tucked in his garment, for he was lightly clad, and jumped into the sea. The other disciples came in the boat, for they were not far from shore, only about a hundred yards, dragging the net with the fish. When they climbed out on shore,

they saw a charcoal fire with fish on it and bread. Jesus said to them, "Bring some of the fish you just caught." So Simon Peter went over and dragged the net ashore full of one hundred fifty-three large fish. Even though there were so many, the net was not torn. Jesus said to them, "Come, have breakfast." And none of the disciples dared to ask him, "Who are you?" because they realized it was the Lord. Jesus came over and took the bread and gave it to them, and in like manner the fish. This was now the third time Jesus was revealed to his disciples after being raised from the dead. When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." He said to him, "Feed my lambs." He then said to him a second time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." He said to him, "Tend my sheep." He said to him the third time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" Peter was distressed that he had said to him a third time, "Do you love me?" and he said to him, "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you." (Jesus) said to him, "Feed my sheep. Amen, amen, I say to you, when you were younger, you used to dress yourself and go where you wanted; but when you grow old, you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will dress you and lead you where you do not want to go." He said this signifying by what kind of death he would glorify God. And when he had said this, he said to him, "Follow me."

Questions for Adults:

Why did Jesus ask Simon Peter 3 times "Do you love me?" How does Jesus reassure Simon Peter that their relationship is restored? In what ways can you heal a broken relationship in your life, not only with your words but your actions as well?

Questions for Children:

Jesus knows how important food is. It nourishes us and helps us to grow. What kind of food does Jesus offer that is good for our soul?

Gospel April 21, 2013

John 10:27-30 – 4th Sunday of Easter

My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish. No one can take them out of my hand. My Father, who has given them to me, is greater than all, and no one can take them out of the Father's hand. The Father and I are one."

Questions for Adults:

What are the metaphors Jesus uses in today's Gospel to describe his relationship with his followers? What kinds of things do these metaphors represent to us?

How does Jesus describe his relationship with God?
When do you feel the closest to God?

Questions for Children:

The sheep follows the shepherd. Who follows Jesus?
How does a shepherd care for his sheep? How does Jesus care for us?

Gospel April 28, 2013

John 13:31-33a, 34-35 – 5th Sunday of Easter

When he had left, Jesus said, "Now is the Son of Man glorified, and God is glorified in him. [If God is glorified in him,] God will also glorify him in himself, and he will glorify him at once. My children, I will be with you only a little while longer. You will look for me, and as I told the Jews, 'Where I go you cannot come,' so now I say it to you. I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another. This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

Questions for Adults:

When is it less difficult to show love to those around us? When is it more difficult? When love is difficult, what do we do?

Questions for Children:

Jesus didn't just tell us to love one another. He showed us how to love one another. In what ways did Jesus show us how to love? In what ways do you follow Jesus' example?

Prayer for Our New Pope

O God, who in your providential design willed that your Church be built upon blessed Peter, whom you set over the other Apostles, look with favor, We pray, on Francis, our Pope and grant that he, whom you have made Peter's successor, may be for your people a visible source and foundation of unity in faith and of communion.
