MAIN EVENT THANK YOU

I want to thank *Nazare Judd, Evelyn Feliciano, Jolene Ferreira, and Jeanette Nunes*, our *PSA Main Event Chairs*, for their outstanding and overwhelmingly successful work on this year's PSA Main Event Auction, "Masquerade Ball 2013". I would also like to thank *Amelia McDermott*, who chaired this year's very successful PSA Main Event Raffle. The Masquerade Ball 2013 was a huge success and will be remembered for many years. I also want to thank all their committee chairs and workers for their dedication. Through today's date, the Masquerade Ball 2013 and PSA Main Event Raffle combined have netted the school **\$135,725.92!** The Main Event Auction and Post Auction Sales, including an anonymous Fund-A-Wish matching donation of \$10,000, generated a net of \$121,268.45 and the PSA Main Event Raffle earned a net \$14,457.47. Thank you again to the Main Event Masquerade Ball Chairs, the Main Event Raffle Chair and all the committee members who worked so tirelessly to ensure such fabulous and fun events! NEW iPADS ORDERED

The Main Event Fund-A-Wish monies and matching donation allocated for iPads totaled **\$19,975.00**. We are in the process of purchasing additional student iPads, a charging cart, and related accessories. The addition of these products will add tremendously to the enrichment of the curriculum. MADELEINE MAIN EVENT CHAIRS NEEDED FOR 2013-2014

We are in **desperate need** of chairs for the **Madeleine Main Event for the 2013-2014** school year. Many of the committee heads are already in place for next year and research has begun on available hotels. Again, this year we have reorganized this event to help to make it easier for the chairs! Please, if you have been thinking of being a chair, this would be a great year to step forward and to volunteer. There are many good parents who are willing to support you as the Main Event Chair.

ESTABLISHING SUPPORTING PARISHIONER RATE

To establish a supporting parishioner discount rate for future school years, you must use your weekly collection envelopes on a regular basis. This must be done for one year (July to June) prior to establishing a supporting parishioner status. **Envelopes** turned in to the **rectory mail drop** do not count toward establishing supporting parishioner status. In addition, multiple envelopes turned into the collection basket at one time may not be counted toward establishing the supportive parishioner rate.

2013-2014 SCHOOL YEAR TUITION PAYMENT SCHEDULE

School of the Madeleine changed the tuition and student fees schedule for the 2013-2014 school year. All families should have paid **student fees for the following academic year by May 1**. **This fee reserves a seat for your child for the next school year**. **The first tuition payment will be due in July**. This new tuition schedule would have the last tuition payment due in April. This will help the school to better know its enrollment numbers and accept new students faster. Many school families now do not inform the school that they are planning to leave until August or even September. Often this leaves the school with no available students on the waiting lists because potential families have enrolled in their second choice of schools. Both student fees and the first month tuition **will be non-refundable**. **Tuition coupon books** for the 2013-2014 school year were sent home by mail in **April**. Please call the school office if you have not received it.

TUITION AND COMMITMENT PAYMENTS

Please remember that the final tuition payment, PSA fundraiser commitment, and service hours should have been completed by **Wednesday, May 15**. Therefore, all accounts should have been paid in full at this time. Eighth grade balances should have been completed before this date. Any outstanding balance for eighth grade students **will prevent** that child from participating in the Disneyland trip and other graduation activities.

LAST DAY OF SCHOOL

Eighth grade graduation will be **Friday, June 7**. The last day for kindergarten is **Thursday, June 13**. The kindergarten graduation ceremony will take place on this day at 10:30 a.m. in the parish hall. Because of problems in the past, **parents must sign siblings out** at the school office for them to attend kindergarten graduation. Notes to release students without a parent to sign them out cannot be honored. Thank you for your cooperation.

All students including preschool will have minimum days with dismissal at Noon on Wednesday-Friday, (June 12-14). The last day for the remaining students is on **Friday, June 14**.

SCHOOL CALENDAR FOR THE 2013-2014 SCHOOL YEAR

The first day of school for the 2013-2014 will be **Thursday, August 29**. **Thursday and Friday** (August 29 and 30) **are minimum days**. Monday, September 2 is Labor Day and there will be no school! Again, we will have the entire week off for Thanksgiving (11/25-11/29). Because we will be going through the accreditation process next year with the **WCEA** (Western Catholic Education Association) and **WASC** (Western Association of Schools and Colleges), there will be a few more minimum days and full days off to accommodate the writing of the report and preparation for the evaluation team. A detailed calendar for the 2013-2014 school year will be attached to this newsletter.

ADVANCED MATH PROGRAM MEETING

There is a meeting on **Thursday (May 23) at 5:30 p.m.** for 4th grade parents of children who have qualified for our advanced math program for grade 5. Acceptance of students into this program has been reorganized and information/prerequisites will be discussed at this meeting. The meeting will be held in the advanced math room for grades 5 and 6. This room is located in our resource building and is next to the school library.

Gospel June 2, 2013

(Corpus Christi)

Luke 9:11-17

Jesus spoke to the crowds about the kingdom of God, and he healed those who needed to be cured. As the day was drawing to a close, the Twelve approached him and said, "Dismiss the crowd so that they can go to the surrounding villages and farms and find lodging and provisions; for we are in a deserted place here." He said to them, "Give them some food yourselves." They replied, "Five loaves and two fish are all we have, unless we ourselves go and buy food for all these people." Now the men there numbered about five thousand. Then he said to his disciples, "Have them sit down in groups of about fifty." They did so and made them all sit down. Then taking the five loaves and the two fish, and looking up to heaven, he said the blessing over them, broke them, and gave them to the disciples to set before the crowd. They all ate and were satisfied. And when the leftover fragments were picked up, they filled twelve wicker baskets.

Questions for Adults:

What did the Twelve initially want Jesus to do with the crowd? Do we trust God in the face of challenges or people who might be challenging? Do we have faith that God will provide abundantly for us?

Why do so many people put their trust and love in material things? Can material goods ever offer true happiness? Why or why not?

Questions for Children:

When you read about the miracle Jesus performed in today's gospel, what part do you think is the most amazing? What does this miracle tell us about God's love and care for us?

Gospel June 9, 2013

Luke 7:11-17

Jesus journeyed to a city called Nain, and his disciples and a large crowd accompanied him. As he drew near to the gate of the city, a man who had died was being carried out, the only son of his mother, and she was a widow. A large crowd from the city was with her. When the Lord saw her, he was moved with pity for her and said to her, "Do not weep." He stepped forward and touched the coffin; at this the bearers halted, and he said, "Young man, I tell you, arise!" The dead man sat up and began to speak, and Jesus gave him to his mother.

Fear seized them all, and they glorified God, exclaiming, "A great prophet has arisen in our midst," and "God has visited his people." This report about him spread through the whole of Judea and in all the surrounding region.

Questions for Adults:

In this gospel reading, Jesus performs a miracle that shows his power over death. What other qualities of Jesus are shown to us in this gospel?

In what ways can we follow Jesus' example of compassion when we are "moved with pity"?

Questions for Children:

What miracle did Jesus perform in this Gospel? What prompted Jesus to perform the miracle? What was the people's response to Jesus' miracle?

Gospel June 16, 2013

Luke 7:36-8:3

A Pharisee invited Jesus to dine with him, and he entered the Pharisee's house and reclined at table.

Now there was a sinful woman in the city who learned that he was at table in the house of the Pharisee.

Bringing an alabaster flask of ointment, she stood behind him at his feet weeping and began to bathe his feet with her tears.

Then she wiped them with her hair, kissed them, and anointed them with the ointment.

When the Pharisee who had invited him saw this he said to himself,

"If this man were a prophet, he would know who and what sort of woman this is who is touching him, that she is a sinner."

Jesus said to him in reply, "Simon, I have something to say to you."

"Tell me, teacher," he said.

"Two people were in debt to a certain creditor; one owed five hundred days' wages and the other owed fifty."

Since they were unable to repay the debt, he forgave it for both.

Which of them will love him more?"

Simon said in reply,

"The one, I suppose, whose larger debt was forgiven."

He said to him, "You have judged rightly."

Then he turned to the woman and said to Simon, "Do you see this woman?"

When I entered your house, you did not give me water for my feet,

but she has bathed them with her tears
and wiped them with her hair.
You did not give me a kiss,
but she has not ceased kissing my feet since the time
I entered.
You did not anoint my head with oil,
but she anointed my feet with ointment.
So I tell you, her many sins have been forgiven
because she has shown great love.
But the one to whom little is forgiven, loves little.”
He said to her, “Your sins are forgiven.”
The others at table said to themselves,
“Who is this who even forgives sins?”
But he said to the woman,
“Your faith has saved you; go in peace.”

Afterward he journeyed from one town and village to
another,
preaching and proclaiming the good news of the
kingdom of God.
Accompanying him were the Twelve
and some women who had been cured of evil spirits
and infirmities,
Mary, called Magdalene, from whom seven demons
had gone out,
Joanna, the wife of Herod’s steward Chuza,
Susanna, and many others who provided for them
out of their resources.

Questions for Adults:

In your own words, what is the Sacrament of
Reconciliation?

Jesus calls us to forgive others as the Father forgives.
Think about the last time you hurt somebody. Did
you tell them you were sorry? How far should you go
in forgiving others?

Questions for Children:

This week, try to forgive someone who has hurt you.
Remember that Jesus asks us to forgive others, just as
he forgives us.

Gospel June 23, 2013

Luke 9:18-24

Once when Jesus was praying in solitude,
and the disciples were with him,
he asked them, “Who do the crowds say that I am?”
They said in reply, “John the Baptist;
others, Elijah;
still others, ‘One of the ancient prophets has arisen.’”
Then he said to them, “But who do you say that I
am?”
Peter said in reply, “The Christ of God.”
He rebuked them
and directed them not to tell this to anyone.
He said, “The Son of Man must suffer greatly
and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and

the scribes,
and be killed and on the third day be raised.”
Then he said to all,
“If anyone wishes to come after me, he must deny
himself
and take up his cross daily and follow me.
For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it,
but whoever loses his life for my sake will save it.”

Questions for Adults:

What role do the values and comforts of this world
play in your life? How can we put material values
and comforts in a right perspective so we can live a
good Christian life?

Questions for Children:

Think about what you did this week. How well did
your actions show that you follow Jesus? How did
they show Jesus that you are willing to help carry his
cross?

Gospel June 30, 2013

Luke 9:51-62

When the days for Jesus’ being taken up were
fulfilled,
he resolutely determined to journey to Jerusalem,
and he sent messengers ahead of him.
On the way they entered a Samaritan village
to prepare for his reception there,
but they would not welcome him
because the destination of his journey was Jerusalem.
When the disciples James and John saw this they
asked,
“Lord, do you want us to call down fire from heaven
to consume them?”
Jesus turned and rebuked them, and they journeyed to
another village.

As they were proceeding on their journey someone
said to him,
“I will follow you wherever you go.”
Jesus answered him,
“Foxes have dens and birds of the sky have nests,
but the Son of Man has nowhere to rest his head.”

And to another he said, “Follow me.”
But he replied, “Lord, let me go first and bury my
father.”
But he answered him, “Let the dead bury their dead.
But you, go and proclaim the kingdom of God.”
And another said, “I will follow you, Lord,
but first let me say farewell to my family at home.”
To him Jesus said, “No one who sets a hand to the
plow
and looks to what was left behind is fit for the
kingdom of God.”
