Dear Madeleine Parents,

The season of Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, March 5 and ends with the start of the Triduum, which are the three holy days that mark the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus. The season of Lent is an opportunity to look at our lives and see where we could improve. We are called by our loving God to be more than we already are—more loving, more generous, more patient, and more prayerful. In short, it provides us with a chance to examine our lives and become more Christ-like. Lent should be looked at as an opportunity to walk with Jesus through the desert experience, to take up our own crosses, and to follow in His footsteps. It challenges us to walk the path of conversion, to change our hearts, our minds, and our perspective. Help your child experience this journey of faith by inviting him/her to do something positive, “give”, as well as “give up”.

VIRTUE FOR THE MONTH OF MARCH

Our virtue for the month of March is “**Forgiveness.**” This virtue is perfect for the season of Lent. Forgiveness is granting pardon and giving up all claims on an offense. It means releasing the need to be right by not focusing on our anger. When we forgive, we experience freedom from our pain and sorrow and become people who are more loving. Forgiveness transcends revenge, anger, and bitterness. As a community, let us help our children focus and understand the true meaning of this important virtue.

IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS

All students **entering grade 7** are required to have a **Tdap booster immunization.** The proof of this booster **must be given to our school office** by **Thursday, May 1.** This is a county health regulation (AB 354). No child may start school on the first day of school without the Tdap booster immunization records on file. Thank you for your cooperation!

GRANDPARENTS’ DAY

Our annual school Grandparents’ Day is on **Friday, March 28.** Invitations will be sent home in February. This is a great day for us to honor the special people in our lives by inviting grandparents or other significant individuals to our school. Please make sure grandparents save this date.

2014-2015 SCHOOL YEAR TUITION SCHEDULE

Please remember that the school changed its payment schedule last year. The **last tuition payment for the 2013-14 school year** is in **April.** All families will pay **student fees for the following academic year (2014-15) in May** and start the **first tuition payment in July.** This tuition schedule will have the last tuition payment **due in April.** This will help the school to better know its enrollment numbers and accept new students faster. Many school families now do not inform the school that they are planning to leave until August or even September. Often this leaves the school with no available students on the waiting lists because potential families have enrolled in their second choice of schools. Both student fees and the first month tuition **will be non-refundable**

REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ADVANCED MATH PROGRAM

We are very fortunate to be able to offer an advanced math program for our students in grades 5-8. This program is totally free to our families and enables our gifted math students to work beyond their current grade level. The requirements to enter this program are listed below. However, students who do not enter the program starting in fifth grade can test into the advanced math program in later grades.

To enter program:

1. The student's math grades must be mostly "A's" (90%-100%). No math grade can be below a "B" (83%).
2. Iowa Assessments (*IA*) – The student must have National Stanines of 8's or 9's on the math section of the most recent *IA* tests.
3. The student must have an average of "Very Good" (VG) in Responsible Behavior grades on the present report card.
4. Student must complete and master the 5th grade concepts during the summer.
5. The student must pass the 5th grade mastery math test with an 85% or higher given at the beginning of the next school year.
6. Student must maintain academic success in all subjects.

To continue in program:

1. Maintain an 83% grade on course work.
2. 100% completion of all assignments given.
3. Maintain a VG or better behavior grade.
4. Be aware that homework is given on weekends to maintain needed pace of material.
5. Student will be placed on academic probation when grade falls below 83%.
6. Student will have one quarter (report card to report card) to bring up deficiencies.

Opting out of program:

1. If a student opts out of the program, they will not be allowed to enter at a later date.

EARLY MORNING DROP OFF

Please remember that the **campus is not open until 7:45 a.m. in the morning**. No child can be on campus before this time unless they are supervised by a teacher in their classroom or checked in to day care. Free day care does not start **until 7:45 a.m.** Students who are dropped off early will be charged a fee and requested to sign up for the YMCA day care program. Thank you for your cooperation.

CELL PHONE POLICY

Please remember that **no child should use or have their cell phone on them during the school day**. All cell phones must be turned off and left in the student's backpack. After school, cell phones cannot be used or answered until 3:00 p.m. After 3:00 p.m. if a student needs to use their cell phone, they may do so with the permission of the teacher on duty. TEXT ALERTS FOR UNREPORTED ABSENCES

Parents please remember that you must call the school by 9:30 a.m. each day your child is absent, will be late due to medical appointments, or to request homework. If you have not contacted the school office by phone or in writing to report absences you will receive a text alert that your child is not at school. If you receive a text alert, please call the school immediately. When your child returns you must provide a signed note to the teacher explaining the absence. Your phone call is not a replacement for the signed note.

COLD AND FLU SEASON

We are concerned about the health of all the children at school. If your child has had a fever, diarrhea, nasal discharge, vomiting, sore throat, headache, stomachache, earache, skin rash or just not quite him/herself please keep them home for 24 hours.
